Brave Women

Pioneers of Change

railblazers like
Harriet Tubman,
Emily Howland, and
Frances Seward carved out a
new future for all of us in this
fiercely beautiful region. As
the epicenter of the Women's
Rights Movement over 100
years ago, the Finger Lakes
region continues to celebrate
women, both past and present,
who have contributed to the
freedom we experience today.

HISTORICAL STOPS
Pay a visit to the Harriet
Tubman National Historic Park,
a partnership park with the
Harriet Tubman Home, the site
of the equal rights activist and

emancipator's home where Tubman lived for her later 50 years. Tour the Seward House Museum to learn how William Henry Seward's wife, Frances, was the strength and inspiration for the abolition and Underground Railroad movements in the household. Next door, stop by the New York State Equal Rights Heritage Center, a digitally interactive space celebrating the state's history of movements in civil, women's and LGBTQ+ rights.

Travel south to Sherwood, listed on The National Register of Historic Places as the Equal Rights Historic District. Several



of the properties within this district were owned by freed slaves; others by prominent abolitionists and women's rights advocates who sprang from the Quaker faith. Find original women's suffrage posters at the Opendore Project Museum, housed in a portion of the Isabel Howland House. Then, visit the unique Howland Stone Store Museum and find among their cabinet of curiosities a piece of Susan B. Anthony's 78th birthday cake (1898).

WOMEN TRAIL BLAZERS
Harriet Tubman, the Moses of
her people and a conductor
on the Underground Railroad,
settled and remained in Auburn
for the latter part of her life.
Here, she created the Home
for the Aged, now part of
the Harriet Tubman National
Historical Park partnership. Visit
Tubman's grave and leave a
personal memento at the
historic Fort Hill Cemetery in
Auburn.

Sisters Georgiana and Caroline Willard commissioned the renowned Tiffany Glass and Decorating Company of NYC to design and handcraft the entire interior of the Willard Memorial Chapel, showcasing stunning work in stained glass and mosaic tiling. Visit their finished chapel, which stands as the sole complete and unaltered Tiffanydesigned religious interior known to exist.

Further still, explore the homeland of Auburnian Martha Coffin Wright, described by Ann Gordon as the "a stalwart of the state antislavery society and ... one of the inner circle of women's rights leaders." Wright attended the first Women's Rights Convention in the United States and contributed to the passing of the 19th amendment, which granted women the right to vote in 1920. challenge societal norms, and forge a future marked by fearlessness.

ACCESSIBLE ADVENTURES



Cayuga County offers you an array of possibilities as you plan your hike. Here you will find waterfalls, gorges, lakes, creeks, bluffs, meadows, farmlands, gullies, and lush woods. Many trails are pet friendly and some permit cycling as well. The Empire State Trail is one such scenic pathway, connecting communities and showcasing the region's stunning landscapes.

NORTH TO SOUTH
From the ten miles of trails
at Sterling Nature Center and
picturesque sunsets on Lake
Ontario to the waterfalls and
gorge at Fillmore Glen, there are
countless breathtaking trails to
experience! Whether you are

an avid or a new hiker, there is something for everyone to enjoy while exploring the outdoors in Cayuga County.
Ensconced in forest and then opening to farmland, the

opening to farmland, the Auburn-Fleming trail offers seclusion and serenity. Just under two miles long and completely flat, this trail is great for runners and families to enjoy.

RECREATION FOR EVERYONE With dozens of accessible locations, the beauty of nature belongs to everyone. For example, the Owasco Outlet at Emerson Park is wheelchair accessible. Stroll down the winding path on your way to the end of the pier.

With blossoming flowers in the spring, lush greenery in the summer, fall foliage in autumn and snowy landscapes in the winter, hiking in Cayuga County can be enjoyed year-round.

EMERSON PARK

Located on the northern tip of Owasco Lake. Enjoy paved walking paths, giving opportunities to enjoy views of Owasco Lake and the historic Merry-Go-Round Playhouse.

OWASCO FLATS

Along the southern tip of Owasco Lake, enjoy this 89-acre preserve with trails on the lake and inlet.

STERLING NATURE CENTER

A diverse natural habitat encompassing over 1400 acres of forest, wetlands, and meadows with two miles of Lake Ontario shoreline and a brand new visitor center!

FAIR HAVEN STATE PARK

Sitting on Lake Ontario's southeast shore, this park boasts 600 feet of swimming area, stunning bluffs, sandy beaches, and lush woodlands. Various watercraft are available for rental, as well as camp sites and cabins.

FILLMORE GLEN STATE PARK

Named for the 13th President of the US, this park features a replica of the cabin Millard Fillmore lived in nearby, as well as three wooded trails leading into a gorge, a stream-fed swimming hole, five waterfalls, and 60 rental campsites.

LONG POINT STATE PARK

Just south of Aurora, this park features a 4-lane boat launch, playground, hiking trails, and sunset views over Cayuga Lake.

Birding in the Finger Lakes

STERLING NATURE CENTER
1428 acres nestled in the
picturesque setting in Sterling,
the very top of Cayuga County.
The Sterling Nature Center's
mission is to manage and
preserve the natural resources
and to promote the education
and appreciation of nature and
the world around us.

Throughout the year, visitors can partake in educational classes, nature walks, and guided paddles. The adventurous can try snowshoeing along the bluff trails by Great Lake Ontario, free of charge, or explore the wilderness with provided maps.

The site, open year-round, offers hiking, cross-country skiing, and the simple joy of marveling at glacially formed bluffs. Families with strollers, couples, and friends of all ages and abilities, including those with wheelchairs and walkers, can connect with nature amidst the dramatic landscapes.

Exciting developments are underway at the Sterling Nature Center, including a new building that expands spaces for educational programs. The changes will create an "accessible gateway to the surrounding nature center property" to bring the incredible views to all audiences.

HIGH DIVERSITY

Whether birding is your newest hobby, or you're an experienced observer, you can spread your wings here.

A haven for bird enthusiasts, Cayuga County offers a variety of parks and trails showcasing diverse bird species. The expansive Montezuma National Wildlife Refuge, spanning three counties, houses waterfowl in its wetlands, as well as raptors like Bald Eagles.

Explore 157-acres at the Dorothy McIlroy Bird Sanctuary. This nature preserve boasts some of the highest breeding bird diversity in New York State! Our little slice of heaven also features part of the Erie Canal trail, which is open year-round and a great way for all skill levels and abilities to enjoy a leisurely stroll or bike ride while on the prowl for fowl!

Winter brings free programs like snowshoeing, and bird enthusiasts can enjoy private birding tours at the Montezuma National Audubon Center for a fee. The Center's programming suits all ages and abilities, inviting everyone to experience the wonders of birding in the Finger Lakes.

Make a Splash

Fishing, Paddling, and More!

MOST FRESHWATER COASTLINE

Cayuga County boasts the most freshwater coastline in New York. We have a wide range of lakes that will fit your angling and craft style, ranging from the Great Lake Ontario to Finger Lakes Cayuga and Owasco, to small lakes such as Lake Como, Duck Lake, and Otter Lake.

COLD AND WARM WATER FISHING

Fish from the shore, in a stream, or from a motor boat. Cayuga Lake, the largest Finger Lake that lies partially in Cayuga County, is approximately 39 miles long. It's the second deepest Finger Lake, reaching a maximum depth of 435 feet.

The larger lakes such as Ontario, Cayuga, and Owasco offer visiting anglers a wide spectrum of fish: cold water fish include landlocked salmon, and lake, brown, and rainbow trout. Warm water fish, such as largemouth bass, smallmouth bass, northern pike, pickerel, rock bass, yellow perch, sunfish, and crappie can also be found in most of the region's larger bodies of water.

Smaller, shallower lakes, such as Lake Como, Duck Lake, and Otter Lake offer mostly warm water fishing.

A MYRIAD OF EXPERIENCES

Beyond fishing, paddlers, kayakers, and canoers find solace in the calm waters of Cayuga County. Explore the meandering Owasco Lake, immersing yourself in its peaceful ambiance while admiring the picturesque shoreline dotted with cottages and vineyards. For a more adventurous paddle, the Seneca River offers a scenic route through wetlands and forests, providing a chance to encounter diverse wildlife in their natural habitat. Other options include the Cayuga-Seneca Lock and marshes surrounding Howland Island.

Cayuga County's water-based adventures cater to every skill level, from beginners to seasoned enthusiasts.

Whether it's the thrill of a successful fishing expedition, the peacefulness of paddling on a tranquil lake, or the excitement of picking speed in a single or double kayak, Cayuga County offers a myriad of aquatic experiences for nature lovers and water sport enthusiasts alike.

Wines

Inspired By Nature

ith rolling hills and scenic landscapes, Cayuga County stands as a testament to nature's artistry. But it's not just the scenery that's captivating; it's the wines that are truly stealing the spotlight. Our winemakers have found inspiration in the very essence of nature, crafting wines that mirror the beauty and complexity of the environment that surrounds them.

NATURE'S PALETTE IN A GLASS

Winemaking in Cayuga County is an art form, where vintners channel the spirit of the land into every bottle. The fertile soil and deciduous climate provide the perfect conditions for a variety of grapes to flourish, resulting in an impressive array of wines. The Finger Lakes region is internationally renowned for Riesling, but is also known for its Cabernet Franc, Pinot Noir, Sparkling Wines, Chardonnay and Ice Wine, as well as wines made from Native and French American Hybrid grapes.

AN IMMERSIVE EXPERIENCE

Finger Lakes wineries tend to be on the smaller side, compared to west coast wineries, and many are family owned and operated. For this reason, it is not uncommon to meet an owner, winemaker or vineyard manager while visiting a winery.

Winery tasting rooms offer a variety of experiences, from casual walk-in tastings to more in-depth tasting experiences and tours available by appointment. Visitors can enjoy sipping wine in a tasting room, a cellar or in the middle of a vineyard with a beautiful view of Cayuga Lake or Lake Ontario. The scene is laid-back and casual, and the wineries offer warm, welcoming hospitality in addition to world-class wines.

From crisp Chardonnays that capture the essence of a dew-kissed morning to robust Cabernet Sauvignons that embody the richness of the earth, and delicate Rieslings that reflect the region's terroir, each sip speaks to the spirit of the land.







The Craft Beverage Scene

In Cayuga County, a burgeoning craft beverage scene is captivating the palates of locals and visitors alike. Here, visitors can experience an array of craft breweries, cideries, and distilleries, each with its unique flavor profile.

BEER

Our region is world—renowned for wine, but we are also home to a growing number of award-winning craft breweries. The region boasts over 100 craft breweries located along the Finger Lakes that visitors experience across roughly 200 miles in central New York.

Cayuga County's breweries range from very small nano-breweries to cutting-edge microbreweries. Our craft beer scene is second to none, with each brewery offering their own special styles and flavors -- and creative, fun names that

will undoubtedly pique your interest.

With eight breweries, you can

enjoy scenic rural locations like Aurora, Locke & Moravia, or the bustling downtown regions of Auburn and Weedsport. You won't be disappointed at any stop. Ales, lagers, stouts, and sours: We've got them all. Many breweries

disappointed at any stop. Ales, lagers, stouts, and sours: We've got them all. Many breweries now offer board games, live entertainment, trivia nights and more for guests, so pull up a chair, order your pint, and have a (responsibly) good time!

CIDER

In addition to wine, Upstate New York has always been known for its apple orchards and sweet ciders, but hard cider: the apple-based alcoholic beverage (typically about the strength of beer), is rising in popularity as the beverage of choice. Hard ciders can be dry or sweet, mild, or tart; made purely from apples, or with added ingredients like berries and spices.

Sterling Cidery in northern Cayuga County makes all of their craft ciders by hand, starting with fresh-pressed local apples. Their oaken and hopped ciders are aged with American oak and cascade hops, respectively. Pick your favorite to fill the growler to take home with you.

Grisamore Cider Works, and Galmor Farm in the south are

also family run establishments serving up a crisp and refreshing cider, hard or not. Join the fun with tastings, often live entertainment and the rural setting of these craft beverage makers.

History books tell us that Thomas Jefferson and George Washington were huge cider fans, so why not make a little of your own history by enjoying a Finger Lakes Cider?!

CELEBRATING WOMEN BREWERS

The Brave Brews weekend-long winter festival takes place in Auburn, NY, at the beginning of March (Women's History Month).

The festival was inspired by the local success of Pink Boots Collaboration Brew Day® held at Prison City Brewing. This growing event encompasses First Friday programing in Auburn's Historic Sites, ice carving competitions, and Prison City Brewing's fire and ice festival.






Centrally Located


